




## Pakistan Flood Relief 2022-2023

### **INTRODUCTION**

In August 2022, Pakistan was struck by unprecedented floods triggered by heavy monsoon rains. These floods had a devastating impact on communities, leading to the destruction of numerous villages and leaving almost 10 million children requiring urgent, life-saving assistance. Families were forced to live out in the open, lacking access to drinking water, food, and livelihood opportunities, while being exposed to numerous flood-related risks and hazards.

The floods affected millions of people across all four provinces of Pakistan, causing dire distress among the impoverished population. Over 33 million individuals were affected, and the devastation resulted in the destruction of 897,014 houses, with an additional 1,391,467 homes damaged, public health facilities damaged, and water systems and schools rendered non-functional. Tragically, the floods claimed the lives of at least 1,739 people, including 647 children and 114 women. The aftermath was marked by injuries, the spread of waterborne diseases, and the contamination of water sources. Displaced families struggled to find shelter, rebuild their livelihoods, and gain access to basic necessities facing immense challenges in their journey towards recovery.



#### First Phase - Immediate Relief Efforts:

In the first phase of our response, we focused on providing essential aid to meet the immediate needs of the flood-affected population. We distributed essential items such as food, water, tents, mosquito nets, medicines, and deployed medical teams to address health concerns.

#### Second Phase - Build a Home:

Once the immediate relief needs were addressed, we shifted our focus to long-term recovery and rehabilitation. Thanks to your generous commitment of US\$ 500,000.00, we were able to complete 184 homes from your donation of US\$ 200,000.00 till now.

### Third Phase - Economic Upliftment:

As part of the rehabilitation and livelihood restoration of the flood-affected families, alhamdulillah we have supported 322 families till now through your donation of US\$ 100,000.00. The support was not limited to the lending of finance, but proper counseling and guidance was also provided. The funds were provided for various sustainable economic modles, such as setting us small-scale shops, livestock, agriculture farming.
